### **General Information**

The European Judo Union Education Commission is pleased to announce the

**2<sup>nd</sup> POSTER EXHIBITION OF RESEARCH**  
**That will be held prior to**  
**2011 Individual and Team European Judo**  
**Championships (Seniors) Men and Women**  
**in Istanbul, Turkey, on Thursday,**  
**21 April 2011.**

All sessions will consist of presentations of scholarly works related to any aspect of judo. Such areas may include, but are not limited to, topics related to the sport aspect of judo, including exercise physiology, strength and conditioning, sport psychology, injury rehabilitation, rest and recovery, nutrition, and the like. Topics may also include any area of judo history, philosophy, culture, or values as well. The audience will be mixed and include, academics, coaches, officials and the wider judo family. Presenters, please bear this in mind when communicating your research.

Proposals for the Poster presentation will be considered for inclusion in the program if they are received by the date specified below. The final schedule shall include proposals accepted for presentation as well as an invited program.

The European Judo Union is pleased to announce that it will present awards to at least three outstanding posters based on originality, methodology quality, clarity, and contribution to judo.

### **Conditions of Participation**

Any researcher involved in scientific studies of judo may submit a proposed abstract of a poster for consideration. Persons with accepted posters must participate at the time scheduled by the EJU or arrange to have the poster presented by an appropriate substitute. All presenters must also register for the Presentation as participants. Posters will be selected for display in the competition venue at the European Championships on the following days.

The participants also accept to give to the EJU the rights to publish their posters on the EJU web-site and in the poster book.

## **Rules for Participation**

1. At the EJU Poster Exhibition could be presented scientific poster from a university of any European country, in every discipline connected to judo Teaching and coaching areas.
2. Authors from EJU countries will be admitted to prize competition.
3. Only one poster for author or group will be admitted to prize competition.
4. If more posters will be presented by the same author or group, the other posters would be exhibited outside prize competition.
5. Every author or Group must send to the EJU Commission one Abstract of 300 words and a PDF copy of the poster for the Journal of Presentation.
6. Scientific group's Poster (minimum three authors or more) with only one author outside EJU countries will be admitted to EJU Prize competition.
7. Poster with Group or author outside the EJU countries could be presented, but outside prize competition.
8. All the participants from EJU countries will be awarded of EJU participation certificate.

These Participation Rules would be published (for the authors knowledge) on the EJU site before the exhibition.

As already established in the Vienna meeting by the Didactic Commission the money Prize will be awarded to develop future researches or to buy scientific instrumentations for future researches in the Judo Knowledge fields.

Papers with the results of these researches will be sent to the Didactic Commission at the end of researches and published on the EJU site.

The three winners will be awarded during the prize giving ceremony of the EJU Judo championship:

- 1<sup>st</sup> place: 1500€
- 2<sup>nd</sup> place: 1000€
- 3<sup>rd</sup> place: 500€

## **Procedures for Submitting Proposals**

Poster presentations. These are stand-alone presentations of the authors' scholarly work on a judo-related topic. A specific time will be designated for poster authors to be available for discussion. Poster boards (minimum size A0) will be provided to authors. Selected posters should be made available in pdf format on CD at Registration, for inclusion on the EJU website.

### **Instructions for Submitting a Proposal for Poster Presentations**

The following information must be submitted to be considered for presentation:

1. Poster Presentation Proposal Cover Sheet
2. Individual Presentation Abstract (300 words or less each)

### **Submission Instructions**

Abstracts should be submitted in English. This will be the official language for all posters. Type information directly into the forms provided and sent via email attachment to

by the specified deadline. If possible send the files as a Microsoft Word attachment, with the name of the lead researcher in the filename.
