General Information



Due to the overwhelming response by judo research specialists around the world in 1999 (Birmingham, England), 2001 (Munich, Germany), 2003 (Osaka, Japan), 2005 (Cairo, Egypt), 2007 (Rio de Janeiro, Brazil), and 2009 (Rotterdam, The Netherlands), the International Association of Judo Researchers is pleased to announce the 7th *International Judo Research Symposium*. The Symposium will be held prior to the IJF Senior World Judo Championships in Paris, France, on Monday 22 August 2011.

The International Judo Research Symposium will include research symposia, oral presentations, and poster presentations of research. This document is the first call for programmes.

All sessions will consist of presentations of scholarly works related to judo. Presentations may involve any scholarly work related to any aspect of judo. Such areas may include, but are not limited to, topics related to the sport aspect of judo, including exercise physiology, strength and conditioning, sport psychology, injury rehabilitation, rest and recovery, nutrition, and the like. Topics may also include any area of judo history, philosophy, culture, or values as well.

The audience will be mixed and include, academics, coaches, officials and the wider judo family.

Proposals for all sessions will be considered for inclusion in the program if they are received by the date specified below. The final schedule shall include proposals accepted for presentation as well as an invited program.

As in the past, the IAJR is pleased to announce that it will present awards to at least three outstanding presentations and posters based on originality, methodology quality, clarity, and contribution to judo.

Rules for Participation

Any researcher involved in scientific studies of judo may submit a proposed abstract for consideration. An individual may submit up to three proposals. Persons with accepted presentations or posters must participate at the time scheduled by the IAJR or arrange to have the presentation or poster presented by an appropriate substitute. All researchers must also register for the Symposium as participants. Posters will be selected for display in the competition venue at the Senior World Championships on the following days.

<u>Oral presentations</u>. These are oral presentations of the author's scholarly work on a judo-related topic. Presentations are generally between 12-15 minutes total length, plus time for questions and answers.

<u>Poster presentations</u>. These are stand-alone presentations of the authors' scholarly work on a judo-related topic. A specific date and time will be designated for poster authors to be available for discussion. Poster boards (Size A1) will be provided to authors.

Submission Instructions



The following information must be submitted to be considered for presentation:

- 1. Oral or Poster Presentation Proposal Cover Sheet
- 2. Individual Presentation Abstract (300 words or less each)
- 3. Applicant fee of €80 for members of the IAJR (€120 for non-members)

Abstracts must be submitted in English.
